Pastor's COLUMN

“Deflate-gate” provides another headache to close the NFL season that brought us proven allegations of abuse of girlfriends and children that has ended the careers of at least two big name players. These stars and role models profited and fell from a culture that feasts on the phrase “what have you done for me lately?” The NFL as well as stories ranging from ISIS to Ukraine to Nigeria to even crimes in SW Ohio deflates the notion that we are basically good people with just a few bad apples. Too often we buy into the line that we don’t really need Lent. We can skip the ashes, skip the reflection and even skip the cross on the way to a chocolaty Easter.

Paul, (the Apostle, not the world famous musician), points out that all have fallen short. No one, except Jesus Christ has lived a life worthy of being part of God’s family. We may not be abusing our loved ones physically, deflating footballs, or invading countries, but the chasm between our righteousness and Christ’s righteousness is very real. Martin Luther reminds us of how much we need Christ when he teaches us to remember our baptism daily. The only attachment to God strong enough to defeat our issues comes through baptism and the Lord’s Supper. Knowledge is good, acts of charity are great, but at the end of the day the only way to cease smelling like a skunk is through God’s loving mercy.

Until the end of time, people will abuse each other in their families, at work, in our government and in our world. We likely will even have issues of disrespect, power and control in our churches. The message of Lent though not festive provides hope in a world of fallen heroes and dysfunctional families and nations. We remember that our lives will end and that no matter how successful, rich or famous we are, we all become dust. We remember that all have fallen short, including our leaders, mentors and other people we look up to, and we remember that the one innocent one loved us so much that He bore it all for us. No billion dollar contracts here, just a love worth dying for in a world that is full of self-satisfaction and self-importance.

To help us remember, I have purchased some masonry nails for all that are willing to come to our Ash Wednesday Services and receive one to carry around in your pocket or purse every day until Good Friday. On Good Friday, we will have a time where each person will come forward and

lay the nail at the base of the altar to help us remember that we are the reason Christ died. Together we accept responsibility and together we will accept God’s love and forgiveness. We have a great message. May we always reflect on it, keep it central in our lives and share it with a world that lives as if the Cross never happened and the Tomb never opened! God’s peace be with you and your family, and may you share it with everyone you meet!

Prescription Bottles



Many thanks to those who have been bringing in your empty pill bottles. The program has been a great success. The bottles are taken to Matthew 25 Ministries and are then sent to developing countries to be used for distributing medicine.

All plastic pill bottles are accepted, both prescription and over-the-counter bottles. No glass or metal containers are accepted. Be sure to rinse the bottles and remove labels if possible for security purposes. If the label cannot be removed, use a black permanent marker to cross out your name and any pertinent information.

So...drop off EMPTY pill bottles in the container in the Great Hall. This is an easy and inexpensive way to help people in developing countries as well as recycling those bottles; making sure they don't end up in a landfill.

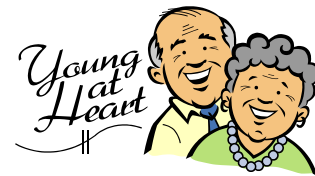
BOOK OF THE MONTH CLUB

The Book of the Month Club will meet on Tuesday, February 3, to discuss *Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone* by J.K. Rowling. Harry Potter has no idea how famous he is. SOUTHERN OHIO INSIGHTS WOMEN OF THE ELCA

You may ask yourself who are these Women of the ELCA in Southern Ohio and why should I care?

My name is Robin Kaelin and I am the current president of our synod Women's Board. This may be the first time you even heard there is a synod board. Even though I was active in my women's group at church at one time I wasn't aware of a larger board. I am hoping you will allow me, over the next year, to have a continuing conversation about the above question in your monthly newsletter.

First let me say that there is no "type". That is to say, if you are a woman in an Evangelical Lutheran Church in America congregation, you are part of the Women of the ELCA. I hope you will join me in looking what this means for you.

The Women of the ELCA have a purpose statement. It is:

As a community of women created in the image of God, called to discipleship in Jesus Christ and empowered by the Holy Spirit, we commit ourselves to grow in faith, affirm our gifts, support one another in our callings, engage in ministry and action, and promote healing and wholeness in the church, the society and the world.

Let's look at the first line. I believe we can all agree that as women in the church we all believe we are created in the image of God. We are each unique, with our different styles, spiritual gifts, talents, and ways of being. And all are part of the women of the ELCA. Whether we are busy career women, homemakers, our grandchildren's mothers, college students, married, pastors, lay leaders, single, readers, quilt-makers, crafters, non-crafters, gardeners, bakers, artists, you name it, we probably are actively multi-tasking and working it.

Over the next months, I encourage you to look around your congregation and community and see all the many ways as women we are active. Is there cohesion? That is to say do we work interdependent of each other or individually?

It's funny, when I first came to the Lutheran church, there seemed to be the women in the church who ran the kitchen and were active and then the rest of us. And if we went into the kitchen it seemed as though we were not welcome. We were threatening the structure of the group. Now I will tell you after several years and getting to learn and love those

ladies, I now know that was my perception, theirs was that they weren't sure we wanted to be part of their group so if they didn't reach out, they could not be rebuffed.

No one wants to be rejected and sometimes it is easier to reject before it happens. There is a much better climate now as we all realize that it is much better to build up each other. I can say in all truth, the kitchen where once everyone felt unwelcome is now the opposite.

I had nothing to do with it, it is the current board at our church that has created this environment of building up each other, but the difference is dramatic. I hope and pray each of you have churches where you feel supported, empowered, and uniquely created in the image of God.

Thank you for allowing me to come into your congregation and to have this conversation. 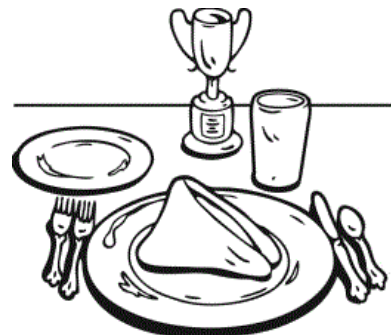

***“For You are my lamp, O Lord;
The Lord shall enlighten my darkness.” -2 Sam.
22:29***

Still having a bit of the Christmas spirit in our lives (perhaps when you read this you will be using a gift you received), I would like to ask you this: What was the best Christmas gift you got when you were around 13 years old? I (Jose Luis) cannot forget the time when I received my first bicycle ... It was amazing! It was blue and had a white seat. As I write this, I'm remembering the feeling of freedom that I had when I rode it.

Many years later, I along with Christy, Dari and some other people from our church here in Mexico, organized a Christmas party for teenagers who live in La Casa del Adolescente. These kids live locked up, protected from their own families, who have hurt them physically, emotionally and spiritually. I guess you could consider it the equivalent of an orphanage for foster kids.

While other teens are bothered by the brand of their new cell phone, here a girl told me, "My mom kicked me out of my house. I've cried a lot but she doesn't want me back. Now I want her to suffer much more than I have." While other girls are playing with their new dolls, here another girl told me: "My stepfather raped me, and when he found out I was pregnant, he kicked me until the baby was aborted."

Please forgive me if you consider these stories too difficult to read. I myself have to focus while writing this letter because I stop seeing the computer and begin to see these girls. Consider this letter in your hands, wet with tears shed by many children for many nights. Covering over these feelings would not do justice to the suffering they've experienced.

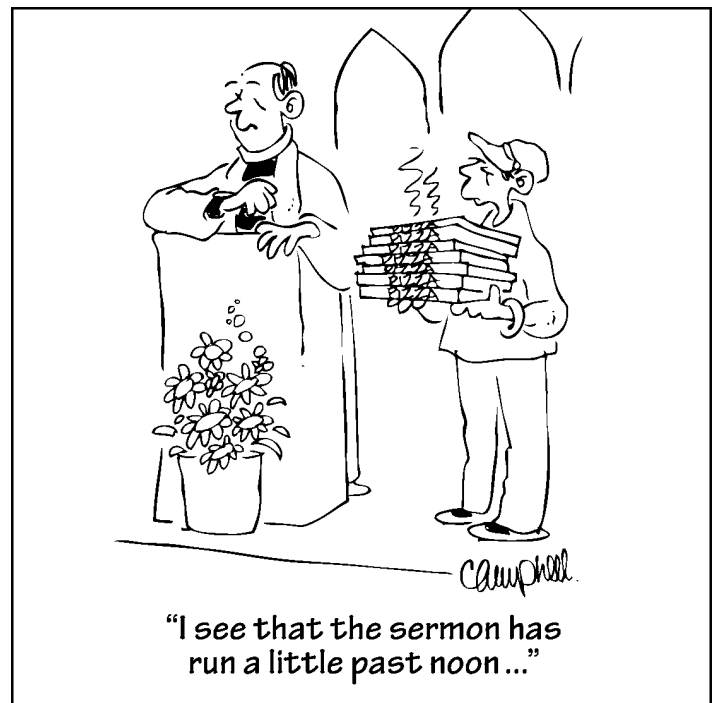
We long for each of these young people to experience a hug from our Heavenly Dad! Our desire is that they'd live the freedom that only Jesus can give! We want them to know that in the end all the

bad memories will be gone. *"He will wipe away every tear from Their Eyes. There will be no more death, sadness, crying, or pain. . All the old ways are gone."* - Rev. 21:4

Please pray for these teens, for healing, comfort, and encounters with the Savior. And pray for us as we work with them, that God would give us a supernatural wisdom to talk to them and that the Holy Spirit would fill us so that we can "rejoice with them that do rejoice, and weep with them that weep"(Romans 12:15).

Thanks for partnering with us on this journey. The Lord continues to open doors to minister and we couldn't do it without you!
